Chairman Lovelett called the meeting to order and asked Mr. Leibowitz to read the roll call.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The November minutes were approved. Motion made by Mr. McLaughlin, seconded by Mr. Baden. All were in favor.

4. EDUCATION & TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

Mr. Doyle made note of the 2017 attendance sheet and term appointments included in the folder. Mr. Baden asked for members that have outside training, to please send certificates in to the county planning office. Mr. Lovelett added to also send proof of training to the local board secretary. Mr. Wilkin noted that he turns in our attendance sheet to the local secretary for the 15 minutes of credit for each UCPB meeting attended.

5. COMMUNITY REPORTS

Mr. Almquist noted that the Honda place in the Town of Ulster where Gold's Gym was (Lia Honda on East Chester St), are packing down and spreading out 30,000 to 40,000 cubic yards of fill.

Ms. Geary stated the Town Supervisor in Gardiner organized a multi-board meeting last night for the Town Board, Planning Board, ZBA and Environmental Conservation Committee. She added there were many issues on the agenda, but noted that solar law was one item. Ms. Geary stated the Town attorney explained how the SEQRA review would work and added that it was an interesting discussion. Mr. Baden noted something similar occurred in Rochester. Mr. Doyle added that we have seen town supervisors meet with board chairs to see what is going on in order to keep coordination going.

Mr. McLaughlin stated that the school district superintendent in Saugerties has expressed concerned with the electronic signs on Washington Ave. He is under the impression they are videotaping every vehicle on the Avenue. Mr. Doyle stated that is not the case.

Mr. Spata inquired about the status of Rail Explorers. Mr. Doyle answered that they have a permit. Mr. Spata asked where to get economic information on rail v trail. Mr. Doyle replied the Camoin study was done on the trail system as a whole. It is specific for the Ashokan rail trail. (U&D Rail Trail) It does not compare the two, but shows the economic benefits of trail.

Mr. Markowitz expressed his thanks to staff for the review of the Town of Wawarsing zoning changes.

Mr. Watkins stated that Town of Shawangunk will be putting out solar law tomorrow night and our board should see it soon. He also thanked the county for the fantastic job on the bridge over the Wallkill and added that it will open December 9th.

Mr. McLaughlan relayed the thanks and appreciation to Paul Andreassen for his years of service on our board from the Mayor of the Village of Saugerties. Mr. McLaughlan thanked Paul personally as well.

6. PLANNING BOARD REPORTS

a. Chairperson Report

Chairman Lovelett noted the status of members' terms and added if members do not have an alternate they should let their community know. The Chairman also asked members to keep track of their term. Mr. Lovelett also thanked Mr. Doyle and staff for their hard work this year.

Nominating Committee – Election of 2018 Officers Ms. Pecora, speaking on behalf of the committee including herself, Mr. Wilkin and Mr. Watkins, stated that we will be keeping the same slate of officers as last year. Mr. Lovelett as Chairman, Mr. Calimano as Vice Chair and Mr. Brooks as Secretary.

Motion to approve committee recommendation made by Mr. McLaughlin, seconded by Mr. Baden. All were in favor.

8. SPECIAL TOPICS DISCUSSION

a. Capital Program Comments – Approval of Draft Letter to County Executive & Legislature

Mr. Doyle noted that Board is required under the Charter to review and make comment on the Capital Program every year. Mr. Doyle had a draft letter for consideration. He noted the Program goes through 2023 and that there are five new items this year. Mr. Doyle stated the new items include a facilities master plan for the college and a highway safety program for adding signage and improving county roads that was previously discussed with the Board. Mr. Doyle also noted another new project to provide new space for the Emergency Management Office.

Mr. Doyle stated that comments for the highway safety project indicate the Board's support for public safety issues that have been identified in the field. Members have sent comments regarding photos and these changes are in the draft. Requests to provide addresses and/or SBLs for projects in certain locations, (Mr. Brooks inquired about Harry Thayer Park.)

Mr. McLaughlin stated this matter was being voted on tonight by the Legislature. Mr. Baden asked if there was anything not on the Capital Program that should be. Mr. Doyle didn't know of anything. He did make note of the adopted Open Space Plan that recommends a cooperative venture for a park in the Ellenville area. Ellenville did receive money toward parks from the Ellenville Million. Mr. McLaughlin stated he would like to start the review earlier next year as he felt the Board's efforts were being wasted. Mr. Doyle stated the Capital Program is not a static document. It is amended all the time by the Legislature as projects come along. Mr. Doyle was asked if the fire training center is being included and he answered, yes, it was as a shared services fire network. Mr. McLaughlin suggested having a special meeting prior to the Legislature meeting next year. Mr. Baden stated that we are getting more time than we used to. Mr. Lovelett added the content we are receiving is much more detailed than we used to get as well. Mr. Wilkin stated that we have agreed to concentrate more on the projects that involve planning. Chairman Lovelett summarized that the Capital Plan is not much different from last year, we modeled our draft letter based on last year's and have tweaked the changes, and we will meet our obligation submitting the comments.

Mr. McLaughlin wanted to amend the letter with comments to remove the bonding of cars.

Mr. Gilmour noted that planning boards are important partners in the Capital Program development. He also noted a couple of typos and added that a capital budget to normalize debt in a single year is important and there could be consideration to make the bullet point stronger to establish a budget and equalize expenditures. Mr. Doyle noted the bullet is the last one on page two. He added that we have made this comment several years in a row. Mr. Doyle stated the Charter contains language for developing a capital budget, of which we remind the Legislature every year. Mr. Doyle noted that most of the Capital Program is devoted to the preservation of assets. Mr. Doyle stated we could add Mr. Gilmour's comment. Mr. McLaughlin asked about adding a comment for tracking projects. Mr. Doyle stated we are looking at the projects broadly so far as to what our office would review.

Mr. Baden and Ms. Pecora stated we should send a letter to the Charter Revision Committee to request being taken out of the Capital Project review. Chairman Lovelett stated we will examine that at another time. Mr. Gilmour stated that removing our board from the Capital Program is antithetical to Planning. Motion to approve Capital Program comments as presented in draft form without amendments and to send to Legislature and County Executive for consideration made by Mr. Baden. Seconded by Mr. Watkins. Mr. McLaughlin was opposed, the remainder of the Board were in favor.
